Welcome to the Annual Report of Houghton Regis Helpers, the local voluntary Good Neighbour Scheme set up in December 2011.

Our aim is to:

"Provide to the residents of Houghton Regis and Chalton, short term help such as transport, domestic support and household assistance, through local volunteers – and to encourage sustainability, self-help and friendship within the local community"

Since our launch 12 years ago the help and support given by our volunteers has become well established and wide-ranging and the highlight of 2023 was the announcement that we are to receive the King's Award for Voluntary Service. The award will be presented by HM Lord-Lieutenant of Bedfordshire in the Spring of 2024.

Our Organising Committee welcomes you to the Annual General Meeting and thanks you all for your support, commitment and care for the community during what has been another busy year. We hope you enjoy reading and hearing about the work of our volunteers, activities, and other highlights of 2023.



We thank all volunteers who have supported Houghton Regis Helpers during the year. At the close of 2023 we had forty-two volunteers 'on the books'.

Thank You!

Every quarter Houghton Regis Helpers report the number of 'jobs' completed by volunteers to Bedfordshire Rural Communities Charity (BedsRCC), the 'umbrella' organisation for Good Neighbour Schemes in Bedfordshire. The type of support and jobs volunteers carry out is wide-ranging and is summarised in the graph below.

Job Summary - the graph shows the total number of recorded 'jobs' for each category carried out in 2023 (in blue) compared to 2022 (in green).



The overall total in **2023** was 4072 jobs - a 22% increase on the previous year and another new record!

Befriending is on the increase, either through home visits or phone calls for a chat.

Gardening also increased, with 34 residents (compared to 16 in 2022) helped with lawn cutting, hedge and shrub trimming and some weeding. Volunteers, often working as a team, visited each garden an average of three times during the growing season.

Prescription collections are on the rise, partly due to a local pharmacy no longer making their own deliveries.

Clients 2023 - volunteers help residents from across all wards in Houghton Regis, including residents in the new developments in Bidwell West and Linmere, and in Chalton, our neighbouring village.

Houghton Regis Helpers supported **375** residents and households in 2023. Of these,119 were requesting help for the first time. Requests for help and advice are received from residents themselves, from their family, or through referrals by other professionals.

In addition to the help given to individual residents, Houghton Regis Helpers responded to requests for assistance, advice and information from callers from out of the area and worked in partnership with more than 60 other professionals, other organisations and community groups, including:

- professionals in the field of health and social care, such as Adult Social Care, Family Support teams, the Well-Being teams at Titan PCN and Chiltern Vale PCN, and ELFT Mental Health team.
- the Community Partnership and Engagement Team at Central Bedfordshire Council
- Time2Connect Houghton Regis and Houghton Regis Town Council
- Dunstable Food Banks, Small Acts of Kindness Charity and Tibbs Dementia

Cost of Living Crisis

The Cost of Living Crisis Donation funding from Houghton Regis Town Council was extended to March 2024 and therefore we have been able to continue to provide extra support to struggling residents and families in these difficult times. This support has included:

- emergency food supplies;
- store vouchers for the purchase of essential provisions, including food and toiletries;
- top-ups for pre-paid meters;
- Christmas gifts for children;
- exercise books and pencils for refugee children in local hotels;
- and extras for Christmas.

Warm in Winter Bags

In the first couple of months of 2023, volunteers delivered Warm in Winter Bags donated by the charity, Small Acts of Kindness, to 30 residents. These bags were 'warmly' received and in October this year volunteers helped in packing more bags for distribution to residents over the age of 55 who are struggling in the cost of living crisis. By the end of the year we delivered a further 40 bags.



Food Bank Collecting

The partnership working with the Dunstable Food Banks continued in 2023, helping with the collection of food parcels on more than 60 occasions for individuals living alone and for families who were unable to get to the food bank themselves.

Training - volunteers attended in-house Safeguarding Awareness training during April and May 2023 and in July 2023 ten volunteers attended Basic Life Support and Defibrillator training.

November 2023 forty residents attended our Festive Afternoon Tea, which we held this year at the Baptist Church. Joined by our Town Mayor, Cllr Jimmy Carroll, guests enjoyed the entertainment with the OccaZional + Band, singing along to Christmas songs. The tea was a feast of

sandwiches, cakes, mince pies and chocolates! Guests went home with a Christmas gift bag and a smile!
